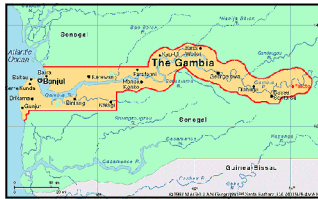

HDI RECEIVES INVITATIONS TO LEAD HOSPITAL/HEALTH MANAGEMENT WORKSHOPS IN FIVE COUNTRIES IN 2005



Gambia, West Africa
June 6-12, 2005

After the successful pilot workshop in the Philippines in April 2004, HDI received invitations to lead or participate in hospital/health management workshops in the following five countries in 2005:

1. Gambia: June 6-12, 2005
Dr. Rufi Macagba, HDI President, and **Prof. Per Gunnar Svensson**, Director General of the International Hospital Federation, will jointly lead a leadership training workshop for the **Department of State of the Gambia** in West Africa. UNDP provided funding. The

workshop will be attended by middle and senior level health leaders of the Department of State. Its aims include capacity building of the staff with the appropriate knowledge and skills in management including resource allocation, utilization, planning, health policy and management.

2. Guatemala: Oct. 3-7.
An American medical missionary in **Guatemala**, **Dr. Mike Soderling**, is organizing the hospital management workshop to be led by **Dr. Rufi Macagba**. **Luis Sena**, an executive of Food for the Hungry (FHI) in the Dominican Republic will join Rufi in leading the workshop, using Spanish as required. Luis and Rufi have led management workshops together in the 90s for FHI field managers in Latin America. Leaders of Christian and other hospitals and clinics in Guatemala are expected to

attend the workshop.

Funding assistance for airfares will be provided by HDI. Other expenses will be covered by registration fees and local donations.

Other workshops:

1. Egypt (Dates to be finalized) The **Sebai Institute in Saudi Arabia** invited the International Hospital Federation to conduct a health management workshop in Egypt. **Dr. Rufi Macagba** will be a member of the international faculty.

2. Myanmar (Awaiting approval by MOH). **Dr. George Dorros, PhD**, of **WHO** sent the invitation to Rufi to jointly conduct the workshop.

3. Thailand (later part of 2005). **Dr. Randy Hoag, PhD**, International President of **Food for the Hungry International** is inviting Rufi to lead a hospital management workshop in the later half of 2005.

China Connection

Dr. Rufi Macagba delivered a 2 1/2-hour lecture at the **Heifei Medical College in Anhui Province** last October on the US health care system and hospital management.

This was part of a **10-day visit by Drs. Rufi and Vicky Macagba** to 3 cities (Beijing, Guilin, and Heifei) arranged by **Mr. Charlie King, PhD, President of the US-China Business Institute** based in Pasadena. Mr. King has asked Rufi to serve as a consultant on preparing Chinese nursing graduates for international employment.

HDI Chairman **Dr. Don Douglas**, a China expert, introduced Mr. King to Dr. Macagba.

In late December, the US-China Business Institute, invited Dr. Macagba to give a **3 1/2 hour lecture to 15 senior government officials from Xinjiang Province in Western China** at the Woodbury University in San Fernando Valley on January 12, 2005.

This group of Chinese officials are here on a 3-month executive development program arranged by the US-China Business Institute. Dr. Macagba was asked to give a lecture on hospital management as a case study in executive development.

HDI collaborates with International Hospital Federation on proposal for funding of hospital management training

In the past few months, **Dr. Rufi Macagba** of HDI with **Prof. P G Svensson** and **Sheila Anazonwu** of the **International Hospital Federation (IHF)** have been collaborating on developing a Letter of Inquiry (LOI) for funding to be submitted to the **Global Health Program of the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation**.

The project aims to empower at least 100 hospitals in the most needy countries of Africa, Asia, and Latin Amer-

ica with improved management and community health involvement to save more lives and promote healthy lifestyles. The project has the following components:

- (1) Ten subsidized workshops for 100 hospitals on effective management for their hospital leaders and department heads,
- (2) On-line and computer-based training, and
- (3) Sending of 25 volunteer consultants on short-term (one

month) visits, spread out over a three year period.

The final draft and budget have been approved by the IHF and will be sent to the Gates Foundation after approval by the HDI Board.

If approved, an international training team will be recruited to lead the workshops. So far, six international trainers have indicated their willingness to be part of the international training team.

Funds Coming in Monthly from Federal Campaign

HDI has received a total of **\$7,477.33 in the past 23 months** from the Combined Federal Campaign of the Health and Medical Charities of America. \$7,247.45 have been pledged for the current 2003 campaign out of which \$4,485.93 have been received from May 2004 to Jan. 2005.

The **stocks** worth \$2,000 donated in January 2004 by a donor from Wisconsin had appreciated in value to over **\$2,480** last September.

John and Juliana Ditty, Board members of HDI, were responsible for introducing HDI to Maguire/ Maguire, a Christian agency that linked HDI with the Health and Medical Charities of America.

HDI's application for the Fall 2005 campaign has also been approved.

HDI needs funds for its international program to strengthen hospital and health management in developing countries —

"envisioning individuals taking more responsibility for their own health care, and providing volunteer consultants to hospitals and other health care providers to effect that goal."
